

The below curriculum outlines the requirements of the concurrent Master of Urban and Environmental Planning (MUEP)/Master of Public Administration (MPA) program. Students are strongly advised to take graduate coursework in the order described. Most MUEP classes are offered only once per year (Fall only or Spring only). If students need to deviate from the below plan, contact the MUEP or MPA Program Coordinator to review options.

Shared Coursework

*Courses indicated with an asterisk are shared between the MUEP and MPA plans of study. No more than 18.0 credits may be shared between the plans of study.

MUEP Core Requirements

The listed classes are required and cannot be waived or substituted, with the exception of PUP 576. PUP 576 may be waived with ample GIS experience. A formal education (degree, certificate, minor) in GIS or specific ASU undergraduate coursework (GIS 205, GIS 211, and GIS 311) automatically qualifies students for the waiver. Any other circumstances (other coursework, internship, volunteer, or work experience) must be petitioned. Submit the *Course Waiver* form to check for waiver eligibility. A substitute course for PUP 576 must be chosen from the *Approved Method Courses* list.

**PUP 520 is normally offered in fall semesters. It will be taught in spring 2022 this year only. Students who deviate from the above recommended course sequence should plan accordingly for future semesters.

MUEP Electives

Any graduate level GCU, GIS, GPH, or PUP course may be taken as elective. Interdisciplinary courses may be taken, but must be approved by the department if they are not on the *Approved MUEP Electives* list. Submit the *Petition for Transfer or Interdisciplinary Elective Courses* form to request approval. Electives may be taken at any time; the outline above is a guideline for distributing enrollment equitably throughout six semesters. A maximum of 6.0 credits of 400-level elective coursework may be

included on the plan of study but must be approved by the MUEP Director. Contact the MPA Program Coordinator for approved PAF electives.

MUEP Culminating Experience

Culminating experience options are a traditional capstone PUP 580 Planning Workshop (5.0 credits), a professional project PUP 593 Applied Project (5.0 credits), or a thesis PUP 599 Thesis (6.0 credits).

Time to Completion

The MUEP/MPA degree is designed to be completed in three years, with a minimum 12.0 credit hours taken per semester (Fall and Spring enrollment only). Fewer hours may be taken but will prolong the time to degree completion.
