

Transdisciplinary Transportation Studies Certificate Plan of Study 2022-2023

The below curriculum outlines the requirements of the Transdisciplinary Transportation Studies certificate program. Exceptions must be approved by the Transdisciplinary Transportation Studies certificate program coordinator.

* The Applied Project consists of an in-depth capstone research paper or professional project. In developing a capstone paper, students are encouraged to work with transportation professionals in their area of interest to identify a topic that is of interest to the broader public.

Electives

The certificate is intended as a transdisciplinary program. Students should choose transportation-related electives from the Approved Electives list following these guidelines:

- 1. 3.0 credits from any **school** in The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (*e.g., School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning*)
- 2. 3.0 credits from a college **outside** of The College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (*e.g., Fulton Schools of Engineering*)
- 3. 3.0 credits from a third subject **prefix** not fulfilled by #1 or #2 above (*e.g., CEE, PUP, GPH, GIS, SOS, PAF*)

Other courses may be taken, but must be approved by the department if they are not on the Approved Electives list. Submit the <u>Petition for Transfer or Interdisciplinary Elective Courses</u> form to request approval.

Course Requirements

The listed classes are required and cannot be waived or substituted. A maximum of 6.0 credits of 400level coursework may be included on the plan of study but must be approved by the Transdisciplinary Transportation Studies certificate program coordinator.

Pre-admission Credit

No more than 6.0 credits taken prior to admission into the Transdisciplinary Transportation Studies certificate program may be included on the plan of study.

The culminating experience is an applied professional project PUP 593 Applied Project: Transportation Capstone.
