

MA Geography Plan of Study BS/MA Accelerated Degree Program 2023-2024

The MA Geography Accelerated Degree program allows students to fast track the Master's program. Undergraduate BS Geography students may take up to 12 credit hours of graduate coursework in their senior year.

The below curriculum outlines the requirements of the MA Geography program. All graduate coursework should be taken in the order described. If students need to deviate from the below plan, contact a <u>graduate advisor</u> to review options.

- *** Students are required to take three (3) credits of an approved methods or statistics course. It is recommended that this be completed at some point during the first year.

Core and Other Requirements

The listed classes are required and cannot be waived or substituted.

MA Geography students are required to take three (3) credits of an approved methods and/or statistics course. A list of methods and statistics courses currently approved can be found on the <u>MA Geography Approved Methods & Statistics Courses</u> list. Courses not on the list can be petition for and approved by SGSUP's AD of Graduate Studies. Submit the <u>Petition for Transfer or Interdisciplinary Elective Courses</u> form to request approval.

Electives

Any graduate level GCU, GIS, GPH, or PUP course may be taken as elective, including Research and Reading & Conference credits. Interdisciplinary courses may be taken, but must be approved by the department. Submit the <u>Petition for Transfer or Interdisciplinary Elective Courses</u> form to request approval. A maximum of six (6.0) credits of 400-level coursework may be included on the plan of study.

Culminating Experience

Students must have an identified faculty advisor to supervise Research and Thesis credits, and to chair the thesis committee. The faculty advisor should be identified by the end of the Fall of the Senior year. Thesis credits may be taken in any combination that adds up to six (6.0), but students are recommended to take them in the final semester of the program. Student should consult with faculty advisor prior to enrolling in thesis.
