

The below curriculum outlines the requirements of the concurrent Master of Urban and Environmental Planning (MUEP)/Master of Sustainable Solutions (MSUS) program. Students are strongly advised to take graduate coursework in the order described. **Many classes are offered only once per year (Fall only or Spring only)**. If students need to deviate from the below plan, contact the MUEP or MSUS Program Coordinator to review options.

MUEP Core Requirements and Other Requirements

The listed classes are required and cannot be waived or substituted.

PUP 542 may be waived for students who took PUP 442 as part of their ASU undergraduate coursework. Submit the <u>Course Waiver</u> form to check for waiver eligibility. A substitute course for PUP 542 must be chosen from the <u>Approved Environmental Planning Courses</u> list.

PUP 576 may be waived with ample GIS experience. A formal education (degree, certificate, minor) in GIS or specific ASU undergraduate coursework (GIS 211 and/or GIS 311) automatically qualifies students for the waiver. Any other circumstances (other coursework, internship, volunteer, or work experience) must be petitioned. Submit the <u>Course Waiver</u> form to check for waiver eligibility. A substitute course for PUP 576 must be chosen from the <u>Approved Method Course</u> list.

MUEP Electives

Any graduate level GCU, GIS, GPH, or PUP course may be taken as elective. Interdisciplinary courses may be taken, but must be approved by the department if they are not on the <u>Approved MUEP Electives</u> list. Submit the <u>Petition for Transfer or Interdisciplinary Elective Courses</u> form to request approval. Electives may be taken at any time; the outline above is a guideline for distributing enrollment equitably

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throughout four semesters. A maximum of 6.0 credits of 400-level coursework may be included on the plan of study but must be approved by the Associate Director of Planning.

Contact the MSUS Program Coordinator for approved MSUS electives.

MUEP Culminating Experience

Culminating experience options are a traditional capstone PUP 580 Planning Workshop (5.0 credits), a professional project PUP 593 Applied Project (5.0 credits), or a thesis PUP 599 Thesis (6.0 credits).

Students electing to do an Applied Project or Thesis must have their Applied Project Scoping Statement or Thesis Proposal signed by all committee members on file to proceed by the time they 1) have earned 75% of the credits required for the MUEP and 2) expect to enroll in their final semester, including the culminating experience credits. Students who do not meet these criteria must 1) change their Plan of Study degree requirements to PUP 580 Planning Workshop culminating experience and 2) enroll the next semester that it is offered.

Time to Completion

The MUEP/MSUS degree is designed to be completed in three years as outlined (Fall and Spring enrollment only). Fewer hours may be taken but will prolong the time to degree completion.
