

**Assistant Professor in Urban Planning - School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning
Arizona State University**

Arizona State University has developed a new model for the American research university, creating an institution committed to excellence, access, and impact. The School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning (SGSUP) at Arizona State University invites applications for an urban planning scholar excited by the prospect of working in this innovative environment. SGSUP is seeking to hire an individual at the Assistant Professor (tenure-track) level, with a preferred start date of August 2020. We encourage applications from individuals with expertise on any planning-related topical area. We are especially interested in growing capacity in the following areas: urban equity, tribal communities, housing, environmental resilience, and economic development.

The successful candidate will teach in our undergraduate, masters, and doctoral planning programs in a variety of modalities (classroom, hybrid, and online) and maintain an active agenda of peer-reviewed publications. The successful candidate will also be expected to develop a vigorous, externally funded research program, mentor at the undergraduate, masters, and doctoral levels, participate in service to the university and profession, and build productive relationships with faculty both within and beyond the School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning.

SGSUP is proudly transdisciplinary. The mission of SGSUP is to advance geospatial knowledge for a complex world, emphasizing education, research, and applied solutions to urban and environmental problems.

In planning, we offer a Bachelor of Science in Planning (both online and in-person), a Master in Urban and Environmental Planning, and a PhD. Our Master of Urban and Environmental Planning program is accredited by the Planning Accreditation Board and is ranked in the top 25 nationally (Planetizen 2017).

ASU is a comprehensive public research university, measured not by whom it excludes, but by whom it includes and how they succeed; advancing research and discovery of public value; and assuming fundamental responsibility for the economic, social, cultural and overall health of the communities it serves. The University's location within the large and fast-growing Phoenix region provides a rich context for applied research and community engagement around issues of housing growth, (sub)urban development patterns, an expanding rail system, livability, health, social equity, energy and water use, and climate change.

Minimum Qualifications:

- A doctorate in urban planning or related field by the time of appointment

- A research focus with the potential to advance the mission of the School of Geographical Sciences and Urban Planning and produce high-impact, peer-reviewed publications
- A well-articulated commitment to excellence in teaching

Desired Qualifications:

- A strong record of research publication in the peer-reviewed literature
- Experience in the development and writing of successful research proposals
- Experience or interest in teaching in a variety of modalities (e.g. classroom, hybrid, and online)
- Demonstrated success meeting the needs of underrepresented student populations and/or reaching out to diverse communities
- Demonstrated success in engaging with the professional planning community and/or practical experience in the planning field

Initial deadline for receipt of complete applications is October 24, 2019. If not filled, reviews will occur every week thereafter until the search is closed. To apply, candidates must submit the following materials online at <http://apply.interfolio.com/68229>

- (1) a cover letter describing qualifications and interest,
- (2) a comprehensive curriculum vitae that includes a complete publication record,
- (3) an outline of future research plans (not to exceed one page),
- (4) a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (not to exceed one page),
- (5) A statement addressing how your past and/or potential contributions to diversity and inclusion will advance ASU's commitment to inclusive excellence (max 1 page).
- (6) contact information (including email addresses and phone number) for three references.
